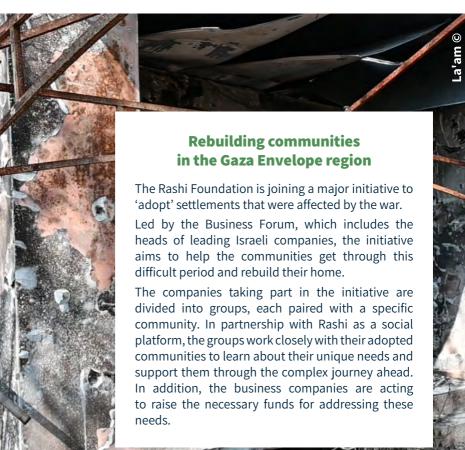

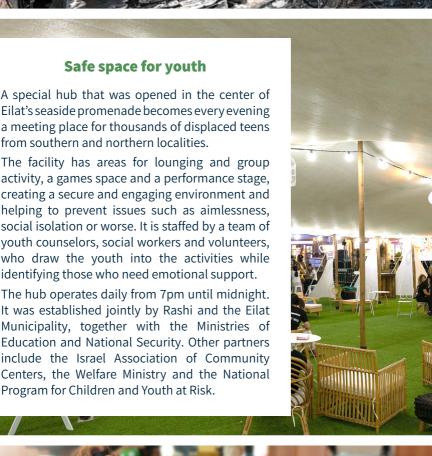

Safe space for youth

Eilat's seaside promenade becomes every evening a meeting place for thousands of displaced teens from southern and northern localities. The facility has areas for lounging and group

activity, a games space and a performance stage, creating a secure and engaging environment and helping to prevent issues such as aimlessness, social isolation or worse. It is staffed by a team of youth counselors, social workers and volunteers, who draw the youth into the activities while identifying those who need emotional support. The hub operates daily from 7pm until midnight. It was established jointly by Rashi and the Eilat

Education and National Security. Other partners include the Israel Association of Community Centers, the Welfare Ministry and the National Program for Children and Youth at Risk.

Additional support channels

Beyond the activity of Rashi and its network of affiliated associations, we assist other relief efforts in response to needs in different areas, among them: emotional and mental support for vulnerable populations, including children and youth in southern communities and women victims of domestic violence; employment solutions for evacuees, with an emphasis on young adults; aid for IDF widows and orphans

and for orphaned children in civil society; and material needs such as food, activity kits for children, and laptop computers for workers of

municipalities, medical and emergency teams.
